In addition to joining the Board, Ms. Costa will continue to serve as President of the Foundation and Vice President — Global Sustainability & Corporate Responsibility for Tiffany & Co., reporting directly to Chairman and CEO Michael J. Kowalski.

Anisa joined Tiffany in 2003 from the Rockefeller Brothers Fund, an \$800 million family foundation based in New York City, where her responsibilities included both foundation communications and grantmaking in the areas of peace and security. Foundation, she was named Tiffany’s first Director — Global Sustainability & Corporate Responsibility in 2009, working directly with the CSR Committee of the Company’s Board of Directors. She became a Vice President of Tiffany & Co. in 2010, and was simultaneously appointed President of The Tiffany & Co. Foundation.

Ms. Costa serves as Co-Chair of the Board of the Environmental Grantmakers Association and a Board member of Philanthropy New York. She holds a bachelor's degree from Columbia University’s Barnard College and a master's degree from Columbia University's School of International and Public Affairs.
